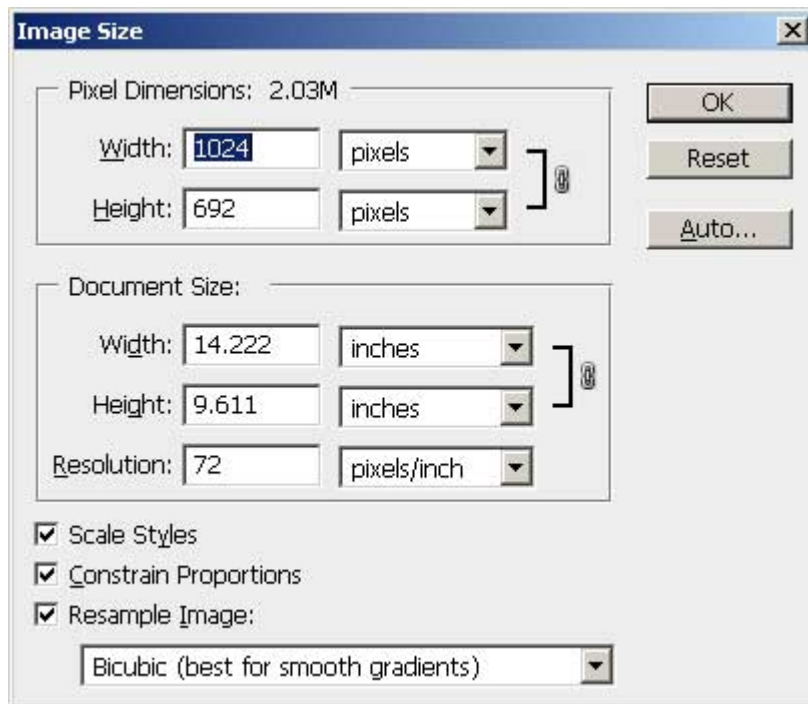


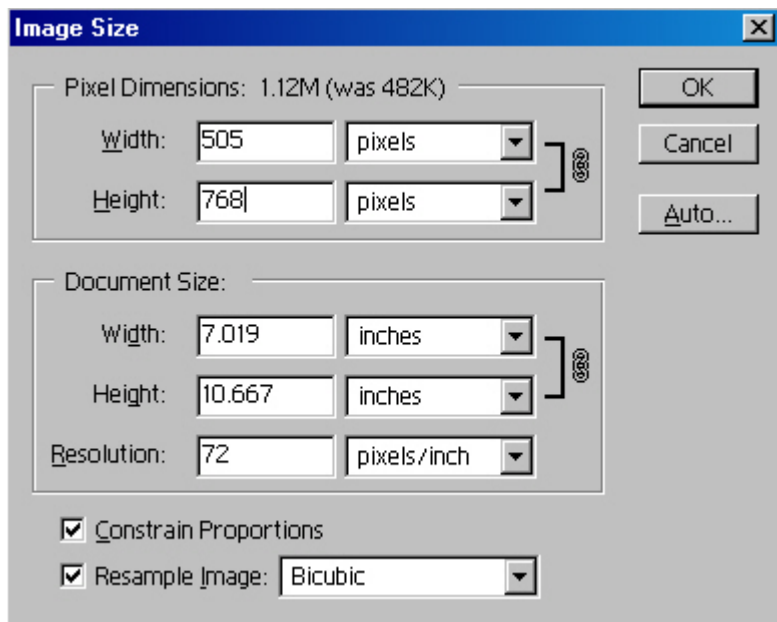
How to Resize and Save Your Image to Within 1024 x 768 Dimensions (XGA)

Follow these steps to prepare the image for entry in a Portland Camera Club projected image competition.

1. In your image editing program (e.g., Photoshop, Elements, PSP), click **Image -> Image Size**.
2. Make sure the "Constrain Proportions" and "Resample Image" checkboxes are checked.
3. Note the two fields under the heading Pixel Dimensions: "Width" and "Height." If your image has a landscape (horizontal) orientation, enter 1024 in the "Width" field. In the following example, the width is 1024 pixels and the height is 692 pixels. This is an example of a correct image size for competition.



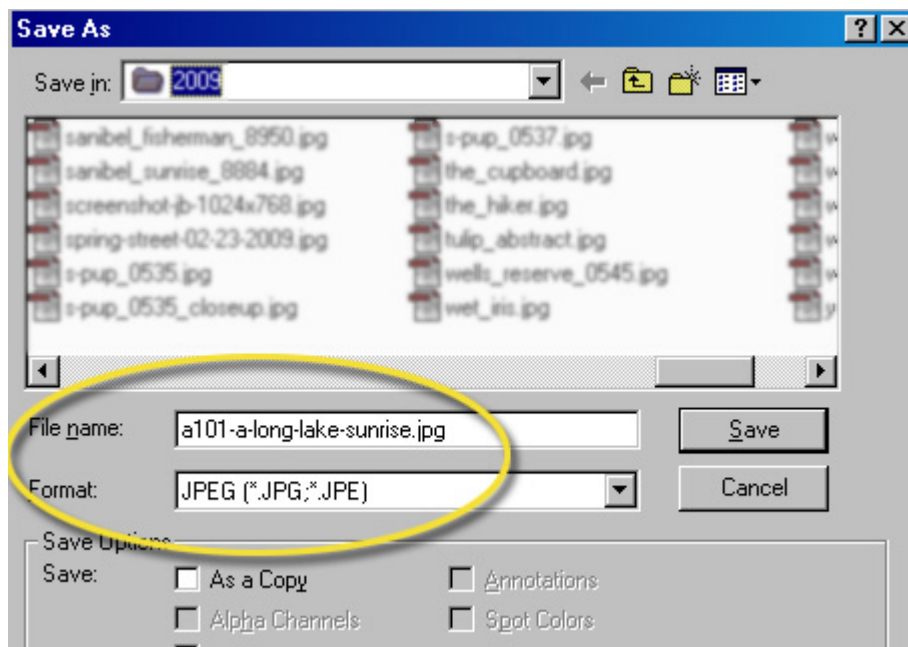
4. If your image has a portrait (vertical) orientation, enter 768 in the "Height" field. In the following example, the width is 505 px and the height is 768 px. This is an example of a correct image size for competition.



The two examples shown above are correct because they are within the XGA dimensions. In other words, the images are within the maximum width of 1024 pixels, and the maximum height of 768 pixels.

Important: do not simply click **Save** at this point because you will overwrite your image file. Instead, use the **Save As** command as described in the next step.

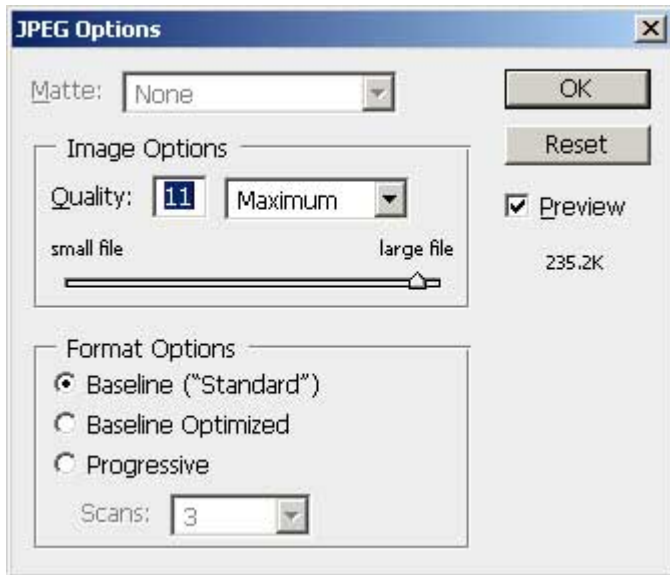
5. Click **File -> Save As**.
6. In the "File name" field, enter your file name in the following format:
competition ID + class (a or b) + image title + .jpg



For example, the screenshot above shows a file named **a101-a-long-lake-sunrise.jpg**.

a101	The member's competition ID.
a	The member competes in Class A.
long-lake-sunrise	The image title is "Long Lake Sunrise."

7. Make sure the "Format" field has JPEG selected, then click the Save button.
8. The JPEG Options window is displayed next. Enter 11 in the "Quality" field, then click the OK button.



Now that your image file is ready to be submitted, go to the club's upload link to upload your image. The address of the upload link will be announced at club meetings and will be shown on the home page of the club's website: www.portlandcameraclub.org.
